## ABOUT THE BOOK FAIR

Thank you to all the parents and grandparents who purchased books at the fair in October. We made approximately \$700 in profit. The money from the book fair will be used to purchase books from various vendors in the coming months. If there is a book that your child would like me to purchase for the library, you or they can contact me and request that I get it for the library. The book fair will be returning in February during teacher conferences (February 10-13, 2020).

## ACCELERATED READING POINTS

All 5<sup>th</sup> grade students and Middle School students are required to have their AR reading points for the 1<sup>st</sup> Trimester by Friday, November 8, 2019.

- 5<sup>th</sup> graders need 10 points (1<sup>st</sup> trimester); 15 points (2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> trimesters)
  - 6<sup>th</sup> graders need 15 points
  - 7<sup>th</sup> graders need 18 points
  - 8<sup>th</sup> graders need 20 points
